

Searching for Articles: Accessing the OVID Electronic Library Discovery Tool

Students may access the OVID Discovery Tool through Athens, located on the Resource tab which also includes many other library databases. Below are some screenshots depicting the path you can take to Ovid Discovery. There are several links within article search results where you can click to try and obtain full text. As always, though, the librarian is available via email or phone to help you with requests and provide research assistance. In Ovid, if an article is not available in full text, there will be an article request form that appears at the bottom of each citation. When you complete this request form, the librarian will receive it and fulfill your request. 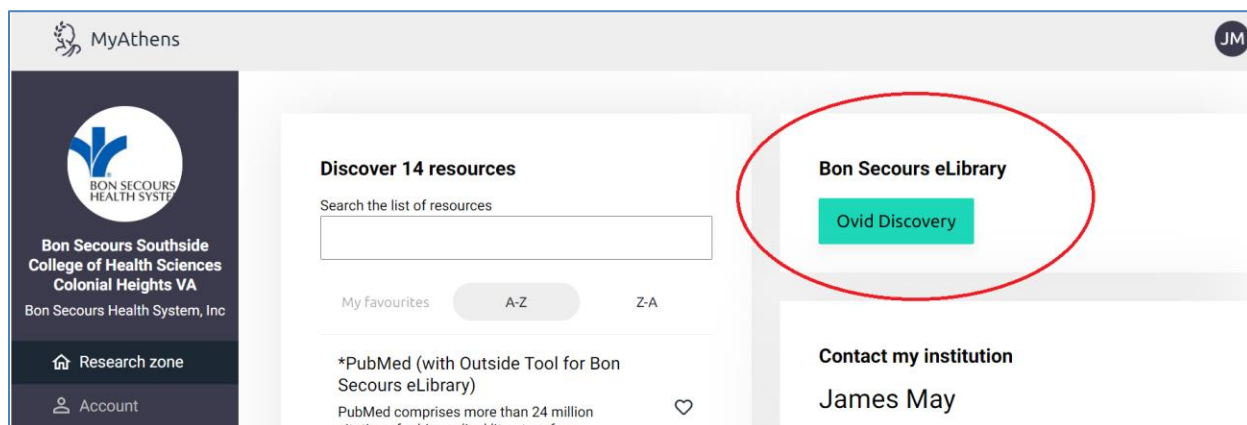
