I. Policy

Required reporting of suspected child abuse or neglect.

II. Purpose

To provide a mechanism for reporting suspected child abuse or neglect.

III. Scope

This policy applies to associates of the Southside College of Health Sciences.

V. Policy Details

Under Virginia law (Code of Virginia § 63.2-1508 - 1515, 1509), anyone employed by a private institution of higher education who, in their professional or official capacity, has reason to suspect that a child has been abused or neglected, is required to report the matter immediately to the Department of Social Services. Southside College of Health Sciences (the "College") also requires that the information be immediately shared with the Director of Compliance and Risk Management so that the College can ensure timely compliance with this law and enhance the protection of children.

The College will also report all suspected child abuse and neglect, including sexual assault, to law enforcement and/or to the Virginia Department of Human Services toll-free child abuse and neglect hotline at 800.522.7096.

The immediate report by an associate can be made as follows:

- If a child is in immediate danger, call the police: 911
- Report directly to local law enforcement and/or to the Virginia Department of Human Services toll-free child abuse and neglect hotline at 800.522.7096

After the immediate report has been made (see above), the secondary report by an associate can be made by calling:

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- 804.706-8051 for Campus Security
- 804.627.5457 for reporting to the Director of Compliance and Risk Management
