DEFINITIONS: OFFENSES

Aggravated Assault	Unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose ofinflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury		
Arson	Willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn with or without intent to defraud a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicleor aircraft, personal property of another, etc.		
Burglary	Unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft		
Dating Violence	Violence committed by a person who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim; andwhere the existence of such a relationship shall be determined based on a consideration of the following factors: • the length of the relationship • the type of the relationship • the frequency of interaction between the persons involved inthe relationship		
Domestic Violence	Felony or misdemeanor crimes of violence committed by a current or former spouse or intimate partner of the victim, by a person with whom the victim shares a child in common, by a person who is cohabitating with or has cohabitated with the victim as a spouse or intimate partner, by a person similarly situated to a spouse of the victim under the domestic or family violentlaws of the jurisdiction or by any other person against an adult or youth victin who is protected from that person's actsunder the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction		
Drug Abuse Violation	The violation of laws prohibiting the production, distribution and/or use of certain controlled substances and the equipmentor devices utilized in their preparation and/or use		
Homicide	 Murder/non-negligent manslaughter: the willful (non-negligent)killing of one human being by another Manslaughter by Negligence: the killing of another personthrough gross negligence 		
Liquor Law Violation	The violation of state or local law or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, or use ofalcoholic beverages.		
Motor Vehicle Theft	The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle		
Robbery	Taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat offorce or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear		

DEFINITIONS: OFFENSES CONTINUED

Sex Offenses Any sexual act directed against another person without the consent of the victim, including instances where the victim isincapable of giving consent Rape: The penetration, no matter how slight, of the vagina or anus with any body part or object, or oral penetration by a sexorgan of another person, without the consent of the victim • Fondling: The touching of the private body parts of another person for the purpose of sexual gratification, without the consent of the victims, including instances where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her age or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental incapacity • Incest: Sexual intercourse between persons who are related to each other within the degrees wherein marriage is prohibited by law • Statutory Rape: Sexual intercourse with a person who is underthe statutory age of consent Stalking Engaging in a course of conduct directed at a specific person thatwould cause a

reasonable person to fear for his or her safety or the safety of others, or suffer substantial emotional distress

Weapons Law Violation

The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, concealment, or use offirearms, cutting instruments, explosives, incendiary devices, or other deadly weapons

DEFINITIONS: GEOGRAPHY

On-Campus	 Any building or property owned or controlled by an institution within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area and usedby the institution in direct support of, or in a manner related to, the institution's educational purposes, including residence halls; and Any building or property that is within or reasonably contiguous to the area identifies in paragraph (1) of this definition, that is owned by the institution but controlled by another person, is frequently used by students, and supports institutional purposes (such as food or other retail vendors)
Non-campus Building or Property	 Any building or property owned or controlled by a student organization that is officially recognized by the institution; or Any building or property owned or controlled by an institutionthat is used in direct support of, or in relation to, the institution's educational purposes, is frequently used by students, and is not within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area of theinstitution

Public Property

All public property, including thoroughfares, streets, sidewalks, and parking facilities, that is within the campus, or immediatelyadjacent to and accessible from the campus
